Our best guess ...

- 15% is car parts -- tire tread, gas caps, taillights, etc.
- 30% is “private” trash that comes from vehicle windows or pickup truck beds
- 55% comes from commercial trucks (plastic strapping, Styrofoam packaging, plastic sheeting, cardboard, product labels)





Possible Solutions

1. Create awareness campaigns to reinforce norms around littering
2. Engage local businesses in reducing roadside trash (ex: staple labels on loads of lumber and reduce single-use plastic.)
3. Offer free dumping in City dumpsters (on a select basis) of trash collected anywhere in the city, including SR-14
4. Step up warnings, oversight and penalties. Enforce littering, “secure your load,” and drinking/open container laws
5. Fully implement RCW 70A.200.120, which requires transfer stations to charge an extra fee for any vehicle arriving with an unsecured load
6. Lobby for a state bottle (beverage container) bill
